Directions for Filling up Schedule and Showing Certificates.

I. FIRST PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION.

Candidates may appear for any one or more subjects of the First Professional Examination after they have passed the Medical Preliminary Examination, or its equivalent, and have—subsequent to passing the Preliminary Examination—attended a qualifying Class or Classes in the subject or subjects for which they propose to appear. On first appearing for this Examination, or part thereof, each Candidate shall be required to fill in the particulars indicated on the first page hereof,* and to produce (1) a Certificate of Registration as a Student of Medicine with the General Medical Council; and (2) Certificates of attendance on recognised Courses of Instruction in the subject or subjects of the First Professional Examination for which the Candidate then proposes to appear. In the case of Chemistry, a Certificate of attendance on a Practical Course is also required. Where any Course has been taken with a recognised Extra-Academical Teacher in Edinburgh, evidence (receipt, class card, certificate, or otherwise) must be produced to show that the fee paid was of the same amount as that payable for the corresponding Class in the University.

II. SECOND PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION.

Candidates who have passed the First Professional Examination may appear for Examination in each of the subjects of the Second Professional Examination after the end of the sixth term of Medical Study. Each Candidate shall be required to fill in the particulars indicated on page 2 hereof* regarding these Courses, and to produce Certificates of attendance on qualifying Systematic and Practical Classes in the subject or subjects for which the Candidate proposes to appear. Where any Course has been taken with a recognised Extra-Academical Teacher in Edinburgh, evidence (receipt, class card, certificate, or otherwise) must be produced to show that the fee paid was of the same amount as that payable for the corresponding Class in the University.

III. THIRD PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION.

Candidates who have passed their Examinations in the subjects comprised in the first and second divisions may be admitted to Examination in each of the subjects of the third division after the end of the ninth term of Medical Study. Each Candidate shall be required to fill in the particulars indicated on page 2 hereof* regarding these Courses, and to produce Certificates of attendance on qualifying Classes in the subject or subjects for which the Candidate proposes to appear. Where any Course has been taken with a recognised Extra-Academical Teacher in Edinburgh, evidence (receipt, class card, certificate, or otherwise) must be produced to show that the fee paid was of the same amount as that payable for the corresponding Class in the University.

IV. FINAL PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION.

Candidates who have passed their Examinations in the subjects comprised in the first, second, and third divisions may be admitted to Examination in each of the subjects of the fourth or final division after they have attended the necessary qualifying Course or Courses in that subject—viz., in Forensic Medicine and Public Health at the end of the Summer preceding the fifth Winter; in Midwifery, Practice of Medicine and Surgery, Clinical Medicine, Clinical Surgery, and Clinical Gynecology at the end of the fifth year of study. Each Candidate shall be required to fill in the particulars indicated on pages 2 and 3 regarding these Courses,* to fill up and sign the Declaration at the foot of page 3, and to produce (1) Certificates of attendance on qualifying Courses, &c., in the subjects for which the Candidate proposes to appear, and in the other subjects required by the Medical Ordinances, and detailed on pages 2 and 3 hereof; and (2) an Extract Registered Certificate of Birth. Failing a Certificate of Birth being produced, the Declaration at the foot of page 3 must be attested by a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace. Where any Course has been taken with a recognised Extra-Academical Teacher in Edinburgh, evidence (receipt, class card, certificate, or otherwise) must be produced to show that the fee paid was of the same amount as that payable for the corresponding Class in the University.

* GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

The Medical Session of each year, or *Annus Medicus*, is constituted by attendance on at least two Courses of not less than one hundred Lectures each, or by attendance on one such Course, and two Courses of not less than fifty Lectures each, with the exception of the Clinical Courses, in which Lectures must be given at least twice a week during the prescribed periods.

Class Certificates must in every case bear that the holder "duly performed the work of the Class."
